live a semi reclusive life restoring Big 15s, running a chook farm, growing my own veges etc etc.

I read with great interest in the last magazine the article on broken D shafts. Frankly I was appalled at the way and method of replacing the worn out originals with danger packed potentially lethal back yard butchery practised by some mechanics. I use that term mechanics loosely because no genuinely competent mechanic would ever dream of putting in a welded replacement. Here my vocation steps in as I was once a practising Metallurgist but now more of a metals man....welding moving

parts like axles, steering gear, drive shafts and the like is a complete no no. It is illegal as well if I am not mistaken. I worked at Hardy Spicer for three and a half years and in that time as Quality Control Manager the inspection of welded joints was a closely controlled activity. Yokes were welded onto solid or hollow shafts....solid bars for front wheel drive applications and hollow shafts for rear wheel drive units. Of course welding had to be done to bring the pieces together but the welding was done at the ends under precisely controlled conditions. The solid drive shaft of varying lengths was one

solid piece of high tensile steel. Front wheel drive shaft replacements done at our repair facility were reworked again with solid pieces of steel. No cobbling up was permitted here.

My message here folks is that if you have or think you have had a shaft repair / replacement done by a backyard garage / non factory outlet.....get it replaced sooner rather than later because later might be too late.

I would like to make mention at this time soon after the beginning of our new year 2016-2017 that renewal subscriptions are but trickling in. We would like to gently

remind one and all that these payments are expected on time and we would like to lessen our time spent in chasing those that tarry. So for those that have yet to renew, please pop your payment to our Membership Secretary tout suite!!

The AGM has come and gone seemingly in a flash... well it was a bit like that as basically we are all back at the helm. I have one more year as President then I am obliged to stand down. 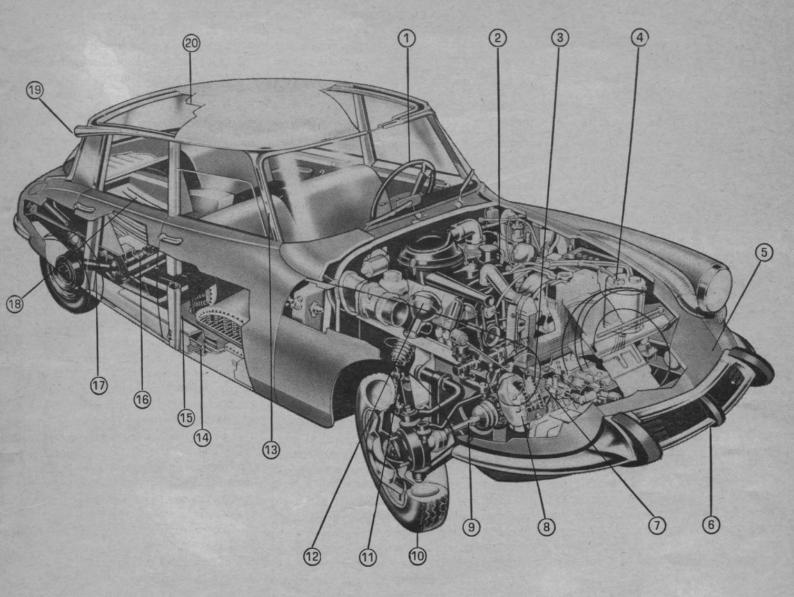

I cannot resist a photo of a Citroen with whitewalls.

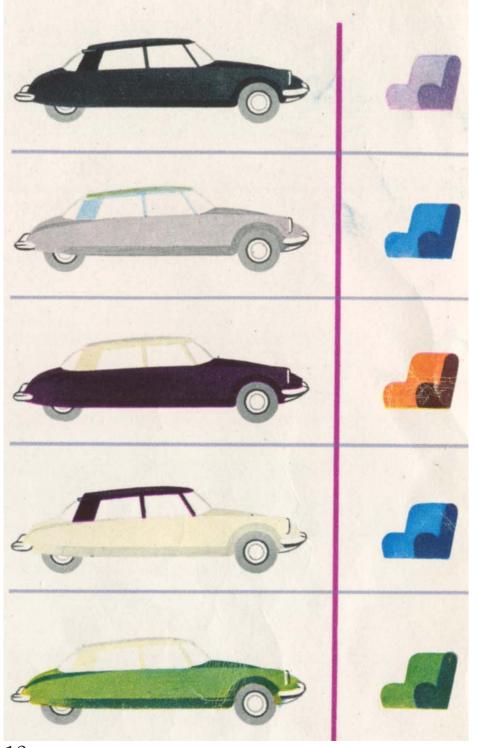

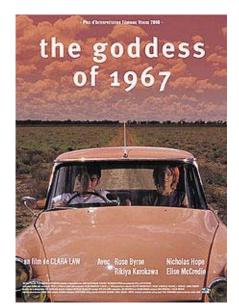

Attachment Points for Towing:

Two holes which are located in the front sidemembers of the chassis and below the bumpers, allow the attachment of a cable for towing.

These points must never be used for lifting the car.

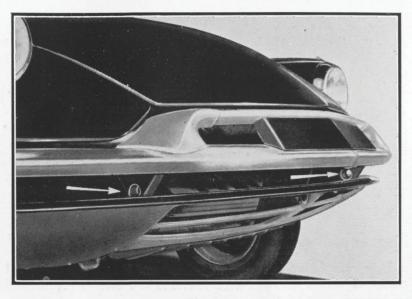

Attachment points for Towing:

The two holes shown on page 29 are not provided on 1960 models.

In case of necessity the DS.19 may be towed for short distances and at reduced speed by a cable or rope passed round, and attached to, the lower arms of the front axle on both sides in such a way that the apex of the triangle so formed can be attached to the towing vehicle. NEVER attach the rope or cable to the front bumper.

Towing Trailers:

Suitable towing attachments can be obtained from our Spare Parts Department or Citroën agents. The total weight towed must not exceed 2,200 lbs. and the towed vehicle must be fitted with an over-run brake.

Spare Parts Report

Greetings from the parts world. I thought it prudent to offer members all options available when overhauling the front end. As vou will see there is a very accomplished engineer (Roger Williams) in the UK offering a quality front end product. The alternate is to buy the parts from **CCOCA** Spares and do this job yourself. To redo the silent blocks you need the following...

2X Front silent blocks (attached to front end of front cradle) 2x Rear silent blocks lattached to rear end

of front cradle) Priced at \$570 for Light 15 and \$620 for **Big 15**

2X short splined shafts (between silent blocks) Priced at \$264 for either model

More often than not one would need these shafts due to corrosion and wear. Prices are at current stock level but variation should not be too much depending on exchange rates when I purchase stock. The silent blocks are sourced through a very good friend of **CCOCA** named Rob Koffjieberg who, living in the Netherlands. only sources quality

On another note I have managed to source 20 only radiator stockings. These are priced at \$16 each and when they're gone they're gone. Obviously spare parts members will be offered first option. The stocking is fitted to the top radiator hose and is designed to trap particles of rust/scale originating from the engine block water jackets. The Traction having a cast iron block tends to produce a lot of slag, which blocks the radiator after an extended period. Anyone redoing a motor should consider fitting one of these as they could save you a lot of pain from an

overheated engine. Recently a member up in Old has had his 3 speed converted to an ID 4- speed. Now I know the purists will get into me but all I can say is...speak to a Traction owner who owns a 4-speed car! Having said that the parts dept has a set of excellent machined output shaft conversions to accomplish this. These items although pricy, were designed and commissioned by one of our members and are far superior to anything I have seen out there. Until next time... hopefully CCOCA parts can assist? Cheers, Lance.

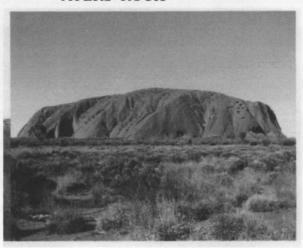

CLUB PERMIT NEWS

With some differences to procedures this year, ie the AGM brought foward a month and the membership renewal form sent to your email address, your "to do list" may not reflect your club obligations?. Check your inbox for 15-2-2016 and note that you can use your credit card to pay over the internet without even printing the membership form. You will have noted on the form that the club year ends on 2-3-16.

Vicroad resuorces are stretched running their day to day operations so they cannot put much into policing the club permit scheme so they have taken to cancelling club eligibility for the scheme where the clubs fail to comply with the rules. The club is obliged to keep a record of permits and their expiry dates and inform Vicroads if a permit holders membership lapses, ie your permit is invalid if you mem-

bership has expired. Vicroads has already suspended 100 clubs from club permit eligability. You do not want your club CCOCA to be the 101st club suspended, so it is on your shoulders to renew your membership. Remember if your permit is cancelled (through lack of club membership) there is no 3 months buffer as when paying rego or renewing your club permit. You will then need to start from scratch again with a new RWC etc

Because of the changes mentioned earlier we have erred on the side of caution (sympathy) and have not yet sent the list of discontinued members to Vicroads. I can see the day approaching when permit holders will need to carry proof of current membership, some clubs are already doing this.
