Ted is perusing Club Model Rules to make us a model example.


Bruce is continuing to upgrade our website with new features such as Paypal to enable the club shop to handle finances a lot easier.



Using a trailer or a bike rack with you Club Permit car, you can order a plate with a matching number for your bike rack or trailer, it will be black and white of course.

The police are clamping down on trailer offence's-namely non load rated (unbranded) shackles joining the safety chain to towbar and those breaking the rules for

registration exempt trailers, ie those displaying the tow vehicles number. The exempt trailer must weigh no more than 200kg unladen, not exceed the width of the towing vehicle, not be a boat trailer and be no more than 3 metres long including the towbar and LOAD ie no overhanging loads, back or side. 



# SCREW IT

Two similar solutions to the same problem lead to swearing, skinned knuckles and of course damaged or broken screws and worn screwdrivers as shown below (caused by using a Phillips screwdriver on Pozidriv screws). Note I believe the correct spelling of Pozidriv is without the e.

Many European cars use Posidriv screws denoted by the 4 raised or indentation marks visible on the surface between the slots.


One story goes that the Phillips screwdriver is designed

to slip out at a certain torque (load) to avoid breaking the screw as it was used in the early days of mass production with simple power screwdrivers. Modern torque sensing screwdrivers make the Posidriv practical on a production line.

Because so many people have been irritated by Phillips and Posidriv screws we have moved on to the standardised Torx that simply spins freely if undersize forcing you to use the correct size.



## ROGER BRUNDLE 23-4-1945 16-4-2016

Today we have farewelled one of the founding members of the Citroen Classic Owners Club of Australia.

ROGER brundle helped to set up CCOCA in 1977, and he has retained an unbroken membership since then, together with his wife Fay.Roger fully restored his Light 15 KSE 442, in the late seventies, and it became a beacon for other members to try and do the same. No one

exceeded Roger's work, and for 20 years his restoration became the bench-mark for others to attain.

His exemplary work on Cotroens became well known around Australia for nearly the next forty years. He freely gave advice to others when asked, but preferred to keep out of the lime-light personally. When Roger and Fay moved to Castlemaine about 15 years ago the house was very suitable for their needs, but the yard was ideal-it had a big shed which was set






